

# School Registers

All schools in the UK are required to maintain a register of attendance. This is a legal document so consequently has to be accurate.

Every child is marked in the register at two points each day, morning and afternoon. This means that over the course of a 190 day academic year, there are 380 'registration points' possible for each child.

Class teachers and the administration team spend a lot of time checking that the school's register is accurate and that all children are accounted for. This process also forms a key part of the school's safeguarding procedures in which every child's whereabouts and status must be recorded.

The school register is used to produce attendance data which is circulated to parents through the year.
