This week Mr Bridden (our Academy Director) and I spent the day in classes to take part in lessons with the children. It was fantastic to see all the pupils and teachers working hard and learning together. The behaviour across the school was exemplary and children were engaged and enthusiastic in every classroom. In our Reception class, children told us what lessons they were having that day and showed us their listening skills. They also sang us a rhyme about the days of the week. Some of our nursery children wowed us with their counting skills and demonstrated their physical prowess on the trikes and bikes. In Year 1, phonics was being taught in different phase groups. We were incredibly impressed with the high level of understanding, as well as the spelling and writing skills the children demonstrated in these sessions. Year 2 pupils were busy with guided reading and the children explained to us how they found information in the texts they were reading.

When we went into Key Stage 2 the lessons got even harder! In Year 3, pupils demonstrated their oral story telling skills and retold the story of The Tortoise and the Hare (with lots of actions and expression!). They used this fable as a structure to help them write their own version and plan their next stage of writing. Year 3 also showed us the range of maths strategies they use to solve challenging problems and impressed us with their addition skills! In Year 4, children were writing myths and learning how to structure their writing in paragraphs. Our other Year 4 class were working on maths problems involving repeated addition and identifying multiples. Year 5 children demonstrated their remarkable maths skills by rounding numbers over 100,000 and Year 6 solved complicated maths problems involving a range of maths operations.

All in all it was a day to remember and the children made me very proud! There was so much to enjoy and celebrate. It was lovely to share in the children's successes and see the work ethic and capabilities of our pupils.

A Heathy Lunchbox

A drink e.g. a small carton of milk, juice, squash or a bottle of water.
One small biscuit e.g. penguin, club, cake bar etc. – This is equivalent to a school meal dessert


