Thank you to all parents that attended the Y2 and Y6 SATs meetings this week. If you were unable to attend, please don't hesitate to contact your class teacher for copies of the slides or information on how to help your child.

We continue to work hard to improve the attendance of pupils in the school. All missed days result in missed learning which will cause further gaps in learning as your child continues their educational journey. If your child is absent it is essential that you keep us well-informed about the reason for absence. Our team is also able to offer advice on whether or not the absence can be authorised or provide information on recommendations on a variety of illnesses. Any absences that the school has not been told about are 'unauthorised'. Unauthorised absences lead to penalty notices. We also do not authorise holidays in term time and these also lead to penalty notices being issued. We have many children who have maintained 100% attendance this academic year. This is an excellent achievement. We continue to aim for all children to reach attendance levels of 97%+.

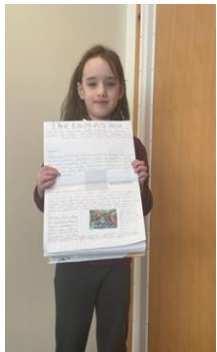

It has been suggested that the number of local dormice in the UK has dropped from around 3.5 million to only 750,000 in almost 30 years. Currently, their conservation status is classed as 'vulnerable'. But some researchers say people should be more concerned for them. A recent report from the University of Exeter urges for hazel dormice to be reclassified as 'endangered' and calls for more conservation action.
