This week the children have been working on activities that reinforce anti-bullying messages. One of our key learning points is to make sure that children understand what bullying is. Our main focus for this is **S.T.O.P.** which stands for **S**everal **T**imes **O**n **P**urpose. This is an easy way to remember the crucial elements in recognising the signs of bullying. We also make sure our pupils know that we are a 'TELLING' school and that it is okay to share information that helps to prevent bullying or challenge bullies. We are lucky enough to work with children who support each other and demonstrate good behaviour. The anti-bullying messages build on that and help us to develop a culture of kindness and respect.

Thank you to all our families for their donations to Children In Need today. This annual event is always a positive way to end anti-bullying week and think about those children who are less fortunate than we are.
